


Adaia Teruel

Barcelona has been my place for more than two decades. The city where I went wild when I was young, where I became an adult, where I've developed as a journalist and created my own family. I want to know what sex life is like in my city, the one that doesn't fit in clicbait headlines. Almost two million people live here, it is impossible to capture its essence in a frivolous statistic. That's why, during the last year, I've dedicated myself to compiling the experiences of Barcelonians who have sex far from the familiar experiences of the majority. By interacting with them I have discovered a city that I dind't know.

I am a reporter who always fantasized about being an anthropologist. I talk to people and listen to them. The raw material of this book comes from my forays into parties, clubs and sexual events, but also from my recordings in sex shops,

sex workers' demonstrations, podcast recordings, workshops on sexuality, encounters in private homes, as well as from my own experiences.



Women who Fuck

Sex is never just sex. To talk about sex is to talk about emotional education, social class, the pressure to have a beautiful body, the myth of romantic love, toxic relationships, feminism and patriarchy. Sex accompanies us all from birth to death, but not all of us experience it in the same way. Salomé has a degree, a doctorate and speaks four languages, but she has never experienced an orgasm. Veronica, on the other hand, has lost count of the ones she has enjoyed; for this single woman there is only one rule: not to repeat twice with the same guy. These are some of the protagonists of *Women who Fuck*, a book of testimonies in which women who have already turned forty narrate in first person, and without holding back, their sexual preferences and fantasies,


but also their fears, their traumas, their insecurities and desires.

Daniel (Zaragoza, 1980) is a journalist specializing in global security issues. He holds a degree in Journalism from the Complutense University of Madrid and a Master's Degree in Terrorism Studies from the University of La Rioja. He has lived in Cairo, Sofia, Bangkok and Istanbul, and in his two decades as a journalist he has worked as a correspondent, special envoy and freelance reporter in more than 50 countries on four continents. He was full-time editor of the international section of the newspaper *El Confidencial* for four years, and since 2019 he has combined his journalistic work with disinformation analysis activities for public and private entities in Spain and Europe, and this book is the result of that experience.



In December 2014, a freight convoy departed from Yiwu, in eastern China, carrying thousands of tons of goods and an ambitious political message. Twelve days and 13,000 kilometers later, after crossing Kazakhstan, Russia, Belarus, Poland, Germany, and France, it arrived in Madrid. The event marked the inauguration of the world's longest freight line—and the symbolic launch of China's Belt and Road Initiative, also known as the "New Silk Road."


The Train is a narrative chronicle of that route and of the world it connects. Written in a style that blends literary reportage and geopolitical analysis, the book retraces the tracks of a colossal project designed to redraw the map of globalization. Each border the train crosses reveals another layer of complexity:

the authoritarian resilience of Russia, European anxieties over dependency, memories of Soviet occupation in Eastern Europe, and the debates in Brussels about how to engage with Beijing's rise.

Abril's account is not limited to facts and figures. Along the way, he gives voice to the people who embody these tensions: Chinese entrepreneurs betting on expansion, European officials navigating uncertainty, dissidents warning of Beijing's influence, and even the fictional echoes of writers such as Cixin Liu, whose speculative imagination mirrors China's global ambitions. The result is both a gripping journey and a lucid reflection on how the future is being negotiated—container by container, border by border.

Bruno (Argentina, 1968) is a Spanish writer and journalist. *Nobody Will Call Us Ancestors* is his tenth book. His work has appeared in the main media outlets and literary magazines in Spain, and he has been a scriptwriter, cultural manager and director of spoken word literary projects.





In 1936, Guillermo Larregui, a Basque emigrant, set out to walk across Argentina pushing a wheelbarrow weighing more than 100 kilos. He covered more than 22,000 kilometers and became a popular folk legend known as El Vasco de la Carretilla. Almost a century later, Bruno Galindo follows his footsteps — and what begins as a travel chronicle soon evolves into a deeply personal and historical investigation.

Nobody Will Call Us Ancestors is a hybrid narrative that blends travel writing, family memoir, historical essay, and literary journalism. Following Larregui's path, Galindo uncovers disturbing truths about his own lineage: Peronist collaborators, wartime fugitives, Nazi sympathizers, and silent matriarchs echoing a lost world. The result is a polyphonic and moving reflection on exile, legacy, displacement, and the deep human impulse to keep moving.



He has lived in Latin America, Southeast Asia, the Balkans and the Middle East long enough to never forget his Cantabrian roots. Between earthquakes, wars and borders, he writes what he sees, hears and feels. He has published in media such as *El País*, *Panenka* and *El Salto*, and coordinates the organization No Name Kitchen, specialized in investigations on border violence that end up being on the front page of *The Guardian* or *Al Jazeera*.

There are a thousand ways to approach an unknown country. There are the obvious ones: reading about its history, its culture, traveling to its most iconic sites, tasting its food. But there are also less popular ones, such as getting to know its inhabitants by having a kickabout. Through this unsuspected method, Ric Fernandez puts on his soccer boots and begins a journey around the world with dribbles, one-twos and many unmarked moves behind his back.

The product of this journey is told in *Kickabout District:* Chronicles of a match without a ball, a wonderful book that synthesizes a return home from the crowded streets of Hanoi to the north of Spain, passing through some of the most unique corners of the planet. In its pages we will meet a constellation of locals who explain in depth the culture, and the political and

social moment that crosses each pitch, each village, and each country we cross. Thus, collecting victories, defeats and memories in the kickabouts, we will follow its protagonist in a story that reads like an adventure novel, but with the depth of the best international chronicles.

The relationship between mothers and daughters is marked by difficulty, disagreement, or pain and often viewed with suspicion. Mothers and daughters seem to be condemned not to understand each other. Why is there so much tension between us? Why is it so common for this bond to be so complex and sometimes so damaging? Are we really all so equal? Why, however, is the father figure usually perceived in a more benign way? If they have to deal with the hateful cliché of the bad mother, we have to deal with the bad daughter. Perhaps the time has come to start questioning how much is true in this and how much is environmental. Maybe it's time to stop

feeling like ruthless, selfish or forgetful daughters. Horrible daughters. In this book, the writer and journalist Blanca Lacasa tries to solve the enigma that seems to surround this link and she does so by talking to experts, turning to theorists or using popular culture, but above all, asking and listening to women so they can tell their experiences.

Rezwana was a 13-year-old Afghan girl when the wooden boat on which she went fron Turkey to Lesbos sank with nearly three hundred people. Her parents, two sisters and brother disappeared at sea. After passing through a refugee camp and three foster families in Greece, Rezwana was reunited with her great-aunt and cousins in Sweden, where she began to rebuild her life, and started to be happy. But when she turned 18, the Swedish authorities decided to send her back to Greece, the first country of arrival. Mariangela Paone recounted the tragedy of that shipwreck on 28 October 2015, and six years later, she met Rezwana in person in Athens. A friendship and a promise


were born: together they would tell the story of Rezwana's family and they would try to find out where the remains were buried. They did not do this alone. Over the years they have woven a network of relationships that have helped them in a mission that seemed impossible: Greek lawyers, Norwegian activists, Spanish photojournalists, Syrian and Afghan refugees...





Izagirre tells the story of Alicia, a 14-year-old girl who lives on the slopes of Cerro Rico de Potosí, the mineral-rich mountain in Bolivia, nowadays a place of grinding poverty. Alicia shares an adobe hut with her mother and younger sister. Although Alicia is officially too young to be employed, she supplements the family income by working shifts in the mine for $2 \in$ a night. Although the mine's rich seams have been exhausted, there are still over 10,000 people working there on a small scale. They dig out the rock by hand and transport it to the surface, where multinationals extract the remaining ore. Izagirre skilfully uses this intimate portrait to tell a larger story, from the Spanish conquistadores to our days.



In 2000, a judge summoned the heroine of this book to tell her that her name was not Mercedes Landa, as she had always believed, but Claudia Poblete. And that the people who had raised her were not her parents, but her kidnappers. Her real parents, two young leftist militants, had been tortured and disappeared in 1978, during the Argentine dictatorship. And she, at only eight months old, was given to a military family as their own daughter. This book explores the tortuous path to rebuild an identity trapped between two worlds of conflicting convictions. And it shows how the tenacity of the victims ends up opening a crack towards the truth.

He joined the German secret services in order to smuggle the historical archives of the Order of the Temple out of Belgium. He transported the archives to Portugal, thereby saving the lives of 238 Belgian and French Templars. He was sentenced to death in Belgium and went into exile in Spain, where he spent the rest of his life. His son Carlos spent more than ten years unearthing and piecing together what his father never told.
